Overview

The Pan American Games are the world's third largest international multi-sport Games; they are only surpassed in size and scope by the Olympic Summer Games and the Asian Games.

The first Pan American Games were held in Buenos Aires, Argentina, in 1951 and the inaugural Parapan American Games were held in Mexico City in 1999. Both the Pan Am and Parapan Am Games are held every four years for the athletes of the 41 Pan American Sport Organizer (PASO) member nations, in the year preceding the Olympic and Paralympic Summer Games.

While the Pan Am Games have been hosted in a dozen countries throughout the Americas, Canada has had the honour of hosting them twice; in 1967 and 1999 and both times in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

In 2015, Toronto will be the proud Host City of the Pan Am and Parapan Am Games.

As a component of the 2015 Pan American Games, 18 municipalities around the Golden Horseshoe are participating, hosting 49 Pan Am Sports.

Transportation

The final transportation plans for the City of Hamilton are still being developed. The goals of the plan will ensure athletes, officials and visitors get to events on time as well as and keep residents and businesses moving. Working with the Pan Am Transportation Team, headed by the MTO along with dedicated City of Hamilton staff, a comprehensive plan impacting all those looking to enjoy the games is being developed to keep traffic moving during the games (temporary traffic measures will be implemented).

In order to implement the goals outlined above the strategy will focus on:

- Keeping the region moving with temporary traffic measures
- Creating a safe, accessible and positive experience for spectators and volunteers
- Getting athletes, officials and media to events safely and on time

During the Games, transportation planners from across the region will work out of one location to coordinate operations and get information out to the public quickly.

Public Transit Implications

At this time, impacts to existing HSR Bus Routes in Hamilton have been identified. The Route #3 CANNON Bus will have a detour beginning July 5th through to the end of the Games, July 27th. The detoured route will be as follows:

Route 3 - CANNON will be detoured around the Stadium beginning July 5.

- Detour Eastbound Cannon St via Wilson St, Sherman Ave, Main St, Gage Ave, Cannon St
- Detour Westbound Cannon St, Gage Ave, King St, Sherman Ave, Cannon St)

There are two options for public transportation to the CIBC Hamilton Pan Am Soccer Stadium and cultural festivals:

- 1. Shuttle service between designated transit stops, festival sites and the CIBC Hamilton Pan Am Soccer Stadium (schedule to be released at a later date)
- 2. Local public transit on HSR buses

Public transit is free to everyone with volunteer accreditation or a ticket to that day's event.

Designated transit stops

There will be four designated transit stops to/ from this venue:

- 1. West Harbour GO Station (accessible)
- 2. Hamilton GO Centre (accessible)
- 3. Hamilton Street Railway (HSR): Gage Avenue North at Barton Street East (accessible)
- 4. Hamilton Street Railway (HSR): Cannon Street East at Lottridge Street (accessible)

A shuttle will transport spectators from the GO stations above to the venue. This shuttle will have accessible service. There is an integrated ticket system with all official cities of the Games including the TTC and GO Transit, providing free rides between cities for those with volunteer accreditation or a ticket to that day's event.

Walk, wheel or cycle

The roadway leading up to this venue will be pedestrian friendly.

Cycling to this venue will be encouraged, and bicycle parking will be available at the Prince of Wales Elementary School (77 Melrose Avenue North, Hamilton) at the corner of Cannon Street and Melrose Avenue. Bicycles will be stored by a valet service at the owner's risk. A bike share program is in place. Bike racks are at the stadium, downtown and at festival sites.

Parking

- Parking will be available at an off-site location, and a shuttle will transport spectators from the parking lot to the venue. (to be advised at a later date)
- Accessible parking spaces will be available and must be booked in advance



Community Torch Bearers

The torch relay will visit Hamilton on June 21 and 22 and will feature Alex Parent, Esther Pauls, Johnny Powless, Lloyd Turner, Melvin Hawkrigg, Susan Palmer-Komar and Ted Michaels as the community torchbearers.

Alex Parent

Alex has flourished in competitive swimming and continues to coach swimmers to achieve provincial, national and international championships. Alex Parent has been an accomplished competitive swimmer, and part of the McMaster swim team. Even after an amputation of one leg at the knee, Alex continued to stay active in swimming. His unique approach to coaching and technical instruction has made him a valued member of the Ancaster Masters Swim team.

Esther Pauls

Ester is a strong leader of Hamilton's running community; she is an inspiration to novice and experienced runners alike. Through the Runner's Den Running Clinics, she has led hundreds of runners to success at every distance from 5k to Marathons. Esther's passion is bringing new runners into the sport, and showing them that they are capable of achieving greatness. She is the race director for the "Hamilton Road2Hope Marathon" which donates approximately \$100,000 per year for the children of CityKidz, & Haiti. Esther also finds time to support other worthy causes, such as Martha's House, Good Shepherd & Jason's House.

Johnny Powless

Johnny Powless (born March 15, 1993 in Six Nations, Ontario) is a professional lacrosse player. Powless currently plays for the Vancouver Stealth of the National Lacrosse League and the Six Nations Chiefs of Major Series Lacrosse. Powless won NLL Championships in each of his first three seasons, and has also won two Mann Cups with the Chiefs. Powless was drafted 5th overall by the Knighthawks in the 2011 entry draft. After winning the NLL Championship with the Knighthawks in his first season (2012), Powless was also given the NLL's Sportsmanship Award. The Knighthawks went on to win the 2013 and 2014 NLL Championships, giving Powless three NLL titles at the age of 21.

Lloyd Turnei

Lloyd is a long standing member of the Hamilton Community. He has been a strong advocate of diversity and multiculturalism long before it became popular. Lloyd is a true Hamilton booster - who for more than 40 years has dedicated his voluntary skills to building the cultural fabric of our city - bringing in "the uncommon voices" to the table. He has been an active leader in the Hamilton Caribbean community-serving in leadership roles on African Canadian Caribbean Association of Hamilton - a 30 plus year old organization dedicated to celebrating the rich and diverse contributions of Caribbean peoples to Hamilton. Lloyd is one of the longest serving members of Hamilton Folk Arts Council - a Hamilton-based non-profit organization committed to the nurturing and promotion of ethnic awareness, and diverse cultural heritage throughout Canada. Each year Lloyd heads up the planning and organizing of the city's largest annual Canada Day celebrations.

Melvin Hawkrigg

Melvin is an exemplary citizen of Hamilton both as an avid athlete and a community business leader. He and his wife Marilyn reside in Waterdown. While attending McMaster University, Mr. Hawkrigg was a member of the football, basketball, hockey and track teams while also earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in history and political economy. He played for the Hamilton Tiger Cats in 1952. After receiving an LLD from McMaster, he was appointed Chancellor in 1998 and served for three terms. He is a member of McMaster University's Sports and Business Halls of Fame.

Susan Palmer-Komar

Susan has been a member of the Canadian Pan Am Games cycling team, where she won silver, and the Canadian Olympic team in Atlanta. She has won Canadian championships in both Road Racing and Time Trials. Although retired from professional racing, Sue continues to race and support other racers. Sue is also very active at Dundana School, running a variety of extra-curricular activities for students including intramurals, school teams, and special event days like Winter Olympics. She is very pro-active in taking courses and workshops to better meet the needs of all students, and she is very diligent in teaching students about the importance of Healthy Eating and Activity habits. She is very supportive of fellow staff members who are just beginning to teach Physical Education, and offers many practical suggestions and assistance. Her efficiency in her role as Report Card administrator is also greatly appreciated by all.

Ted Michaels

Ted is a runner, a HUGE Hamilton booster, an advocate for Mental Health, and a familiar voice to all who listen to AM900 CHML. He's been the heart of the TEAMCHML for the Around the Bay Road Race for years; he's always reaching out to people to make them feel included, heard, and part of our City. His Mind Matters series on the radio brought together people to help reduce the stigma of mental health. He wants people to be whole, through sport, through talk, through aetting help.

Hamilton Kicks It Up! Cultural Festivities

To complement the 16 days of Pan Am Soccer taking place in Hamilton, there will be 16 days of cultural festivities being planned that will bring alive the Culture of the Americas across Hamilton. Hamilton Kicks it Up – Off the Field Action encompasses all of these events.

It's Your Festival Presents CultureMania – July 9th to 12th – Gage Park

Programming will consist of VIVA Hamilton Junior Soccer Celebrations, large LED screens for viewing, a Cultural Arts Area (including Pan Am themed art presentations), a Parade of Cultures in park, Best Cultural Presentation contest, Pan American Ambassadors & High Commissioners Information Centre, Foods of the World highlighting the Pan Americas, entertainment focused on Pan American nations, including international/Pan American specific marquee performers, with Latin American/Caribbean focus.

Pan Promenade at Celebration Square & Art Explosion – July 10th to 24th – Gore Park

For 14 days (11 am to 11 pm), Gore Park will be a central destination to celebrate the TO2015 Pan Am Games. Gore Park is the historical heart of Hamilton, accessible, free and open to all. The Promenade's main centre stage will feature cultural entertainment throughout the day. A variety of Pan American cultures represented in our local music scene will be showcased, as well as key Canadian musical acts. Audiences will also enjoy integrated dance, spoken word and theatrical presentations representing the best of Canada and the Americas. Food trucks/specialty food vendors will be serving special menus highlighting the culinary arts of Pan American countries together with beer garden hospitality area. Vendors provide shopping opportunities, while physical activities (ie. open street soccer, mobile ropes course to name a few) will keep attendees of all ages engaged and entertained. Celebration Square provides a centrally located viewing station in Gore Park with large LED screens that will share highlights of the games.

The "Pan Am Art Explosion" will showcase specially designed sculptures of exploded soccer balls on top of a smooth base. There will be a public art call for local artists to paint the exploded sections of the ball. Once complete, they will be displayed in the Downtown BIA area, and then sold locally upon completion of the Games.

World Music Festival – July 17th to 19th – Gage Park

The Hamilton World Music Festival consists of three days of free music and arts, free educational workshops for children and youth, for local musicians, artists, and community members who bring the world together in Gage Park. The Festival will feature local artists, world musicians based throughout the rest of Canada, international world musicians including Latin and Central America together with multicultural foods. In addition, the festival will create opportunities for local musician to work in collaboration with international artists to showcase the cultural diversity to Hamilton's tourists and residents.

Pan Am Cultural Showcase and Fireworks – July 25th and 26th – Pier 8

A signature free two day closing festival, The Hamilton Waterfront Cultural Showcase will feature high profile international and world renowned local musicians, dance troupes, art displays and performance groups (i.e. Hamilton Aerial Group and Circus Orange). This will provide a common area for the community to gather to watch the Games' final sporting events, enriched with entertainment on a large stage. Food trucks will be available for lunch & dinner service, with an opportunity to showcase arts and craft vendors. Large LED screens will be featured to broadcast the medal matches culminating in a spectacular fireworks display on the Hamilton Harbour.

International Viewing House – Ferguson Station – July 14th to 24th

The International Village will be transforming Ferguson Station into "International House", including foods, entertainment and a viewing station with lounge seating. Each day over the lunch hour they will have musical talent showcasing a different nation in that day's soccer match. On July 12, they will hold a marketplace that will feature goods from various ethnic groups in the area.

International Food Court/Food Central – Ottawa Street - July 11th to 26th

The Ottawa Street BIA will create an "International Food Court" with food trucks to become "food central" for athletes, attendees, ticket holders and visitors to Hamilton. Each food truck and restaurant along Ottawa Street will serve food from the Pan America's with a Canadian twist. When possible, they will also offer entertainment that reflects the rival teams playing on that particular day.\

ArtMatch & Pop-up Shop Multi Arts – Barton Street – July 12th to 26th

Artmatch is part of a larger project connecting art, artists, art works and artistic process to the Pan Am and Parapan Am Games. Presentation of artworks in offsite locations and storefronts along Barton Street near CIBC Stadium is part of this larger event. Approximately seven artists will create a piece that explores and challenges the theme of commodification, consumption and commercialization of the spectacle. Each artist will be offered a studio residency at Centre3 to create new work in either print media or new media. The invited artists are Brendan Fernandes, Shelley Niro, Fiona Kinsella, Steve Mazza, Amelia Jimenez, Erik Jerezano and Dianne Pearce. Rita Camacho Lomeli will be invited to co-curate this project.
